Blueberry Smoothie

Serves: 2



- 2 cups blueberries
- 1 cup Greek yogurt
- 1 cup orange juice
- 2 tablespoon white sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 pinches ground cinnamon
- 4 ice cubes (more or less depending how cold you want it)



Directions:

Blend blueberries, yogurt, orange juice, sugar, vanilla extract, and cinnamon together in blender until smooth.

Add ice cubes and blend until smooth.

- 1 cup hulled strawberries, coarsely chopped
- 1 avocado—peeled, pitted, and coarsely chopped
- 1/4 cup chopped red onion
- 1/2 jalapeno pepper, seeded and finely chopped—or to taste
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh cilantro
- 2 tablespoons fresh lime juice
- 1 pinch freshly ground black pepper—or to taste
